Background

The Environment and Security Initiative (ENVSEC) is a partnership formed by the OSCE, REC, UNDP, UNECE, and UNEP, as well as NATO. Within the current ENVSEC project portfolio (2012-2015), two of the activities are: to build human and institutional capacities for vulnerability and impact assessment, raising awareness of stakeholders and population on climate change and adaptation as well as the reducing ecosystem services loss from climate change effects in the Dinaric Arc Region, through cooperation and dialogue. In the last few years the SEE region has combated climate change, developing relevant document on the topic of adaptation and actively implementing various projects on adaptation to climate change, nonetheless, there are still gaps concerning institutional capacities, to conduct impact and vulnerability studies as well as a knowledge gap concerning the impacts of climate change on ecosystem services within the Dinaric Arc Region. The Austrian Development Agency, the operational unit of Austrian Development Cooperation supports both activities within ENVSEC project portfolio (2012-2015).

Objective

The objective of this joint event is twofold. The regional consultation aims at fostering the regional consultative process and dialogue on climate security risks, adaptation measures for the SEE region and ecological networks in the Dinaric Arc. The main target audience will be climate experts, NGOs, academia and research institutions, and national/local authorities dealing with climate change policies.

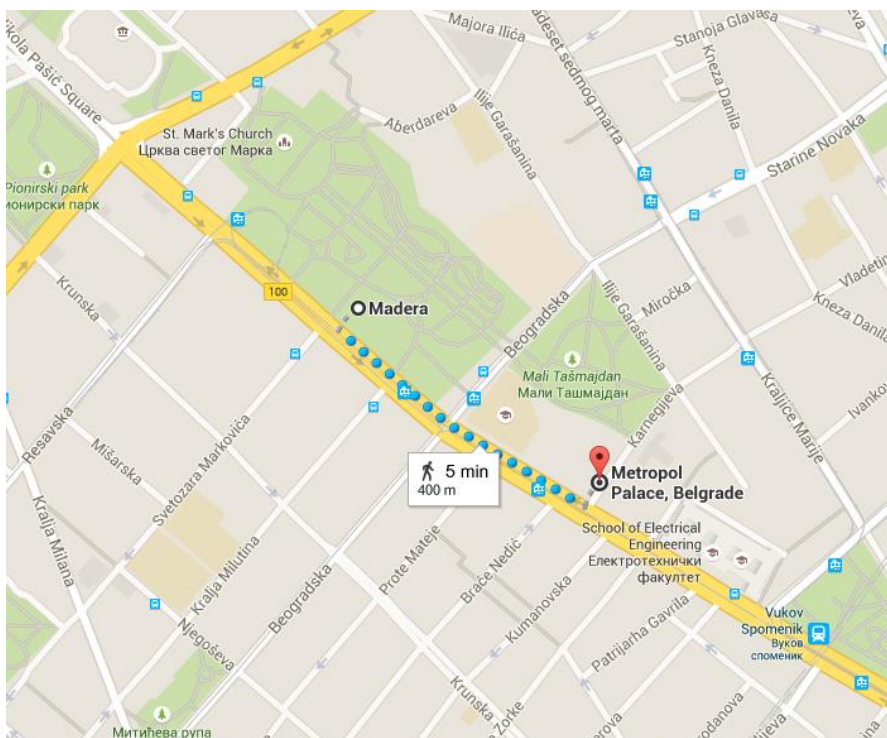
