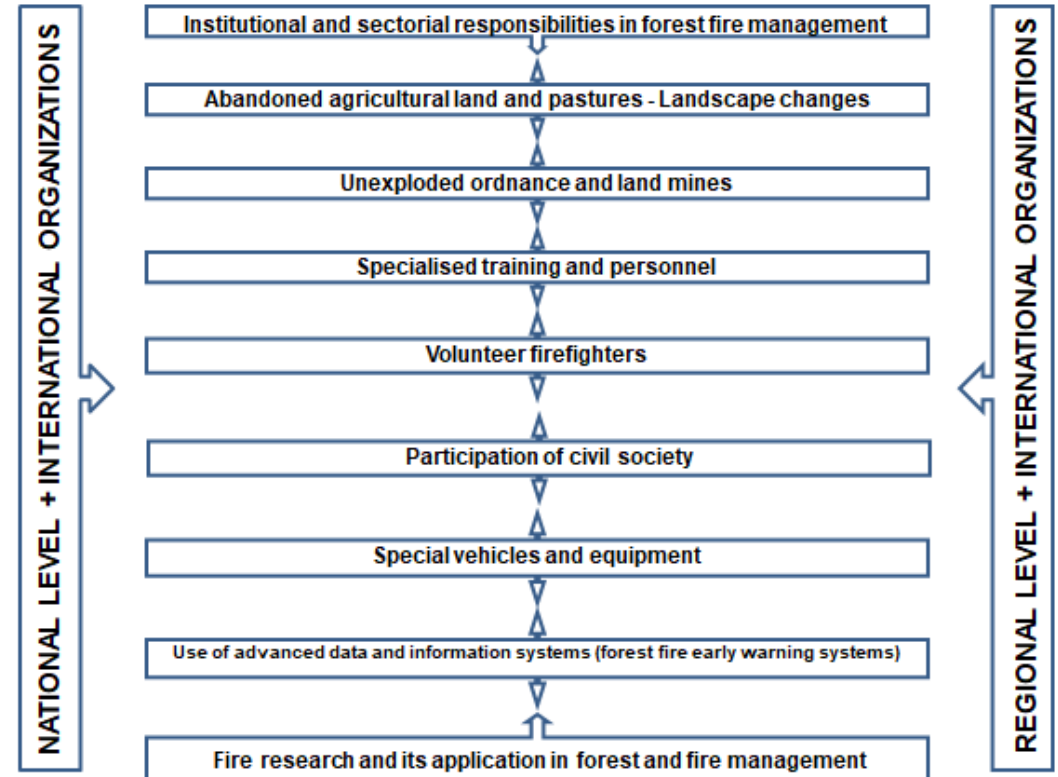

Challenges to Landscape Fire Management during the COVID-19 Pandemic

The COVID-19 pandemic was the biggest challenge in the newest human history and affected not only the human health but also social, economic and political life including activities of the wildland fires regional networks. During the COVID-19 pandemic the Southeast Europe/Caucasus wildland fire network had to redesign the planned activities in that period. Many of them were done remotely and some of them canceled or postponed.

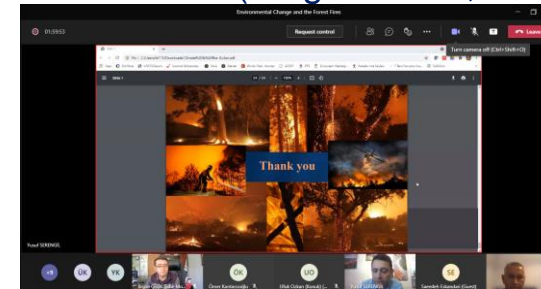

The **Regional Fire Monitoring Center (RFMC)** is Strategic Regional Partner and **Global Fire Monitoring Center (GFMC)** is International Partner.

The overall goal of this LFMWB is to increase resilience of Western Balkan forests and landscapes against fires benefit the people who depend on these landscapes for their livelihoods and socioeconomic development.

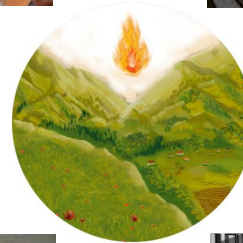
