Regional Southeast Europe / Caucasus Wildland Fire Network

The first proposal for the establishment of a regional network in SE Europe, particularly on the Balkan, was initially discussed by the Global Fire Monitoring Center (GFMC) in June 2002 to promote cooperation in wildland fire research and management under a "South East European Fire Management Network" (SEEFIRE). After the OSCE-led Environmental Assessment Mission to Fire-Affected Areas in Nagorno-Karabakh, in September 2006, the network was designated "Regional Southeast Europe / Caucasus Wildland Fire Network". In 2010, with support of the GFMC and the Council of Europe (CoE / EUR-OPA), the Regional Fire Monitoring Center for the Southeast Europe / Caucasus Region was established in Skopje, Republic of North Macedonia.

The COVID-19 pandemic was the biggest challenge in the newest human history and affected not only the human health but also social, economic and political life including activities of the wildland fires regional networks. During the COVID-19 pandemic the Southeast Europe/Caucasus wildland fire network had to redesign the planned activities in that period. Many of them were done remotely and some of them canceled or postponed.

The main activities of the RSECWFN were:

- Organization of the Workshop: Climate change and landscape fire management in the Western Balkans (SDC/RFMC February 2020, Skopje)
- Participation on the Conference: Environmental Change and the **Forest Fires** (August 2021, Istanbul)

Regional Cooperation




